Kayce received 5 V1 ratings ((highest possible rating). In four shows Kayce won the Terrier group four times, Best Bred By in group four times, RBIS Bred By Exhibitor once, RBIS Overall twice and BIS Bred By Exhibitor twice. Kayce has completed 3 championships since April.
