#### 30 Things To Do With Your Dog(s) While Sheltering In Place

We're all dealing with the stress of having most of our normal daily activities drastically changed during the pandemic. Our dogs are not only our companions and dearest friends; they are also our team mates in performance sports. I believe that they feel the stress and also miss the experiences in sharing these sports with us. Here are 30 things that we can do with our dogs to help keep their bodies and minds active and engaged until things start to get back to some sort of normal.

1. Give your dog a massage while binge watching TV.

2. Buy a new toy and wrap it before giving it to you dog. Give them the fun of unwrapping it.

3. Feed their meals scattered in a new way ... how about folded into a towel?

4. Rotate your dog's loose toys into a toy box, and pull out two new toys that are in the bottom of the box every few days.

5. Pick something to enrich your garden for your dog. Sensory gardens are awesome!

6. Find a new place to walk or explore, and allow your dog at least 10 minutes uninterrupted sniffing.

 Fill a cookie jar with 50 treats/pieces of kibble. Use the whole jar in one day, reinforcing good things around the house. Have another container with 50 human treats for yourself to reinforce working with your dog.

8. Feed breakfast in a kong (or similar container). Put their dinner in another kong and freeze it.

9. Give your dog a box, junk mail or an ugly Christmas card to shred.

10. Throw your dog's meal over the grass in the yard. Pick an area they don't normally toilet in 🛙

11. Add one high nutritional food to your dog's regular dinner. Buy some healthy special treats that your dog hasn't had before.

12. Teach your dog to dig and show them one place at your house where they are allowed to dig.

13. Spend a whole day without saying "No", telling off, or yelling at your dog.

14. Find a new off lead walking spot to explore.

15. Train a new behavior with you entirely behind an Xpen. This is "barrier training".

16. Make a snuffle item i.e., a snuffle ball, snuffle mat or a snuffle box for your dog.

17. Train a simple new trick using LOTS of reinforcement.

18. Feed your dog's dinner in a brown paper bag.

19. Make sure your dog is groomed, nails done, and looking snazzy even if it's just to stay home.

20. Train a new super cute interaction with a Christmas object. Take those cute Christmas pictures now.

21. Take a long hike with your dogs if possible.

22. Wrap a gift for your dog and let him unwrap it.

23. Put some crumpled waste paper, an old sock, etc. in a box and throw a handful of kibble or treats in and let the sniffling begin!

24. Rotate some of the toys that your dog has had in the house for a while into storage. When you bring them out again in a few months time it will be like they have brand new toys.

25. Earn a trick title on line.

26. Think about your dog's goals for 2020. Consider what sport(s) your dog genuinely enjoys, stress levels, and if you want to try something new.

27. Reflect on the positive changes to your dog's life that you have made this year. Hug your dog.

28. Sign up for a new on-line class with your dog.

29. Hide your dog's leash somewhere in your home and let him find it.

30. Curl up on the sofa with your dog and think about your best memories with him from the past year.

We will get through this horrible time. When we do, I know that I'll have a greater appreciation for all the things I have the privilege of doing with my dogs. In the meantime, stay home and stay safe!!!
